

Resolution to Annex Certain Territory.

At a regular meeting of Council held on the 12th day of September 1882. On motion the following resolution was adopted by the following vote - Yeas Childs, Dillaway Drury Miller & Peters.

Nays, Hayner,

Resolved that the committee on Public Property assisted by the Village Engineers be and are hereby instructed to report at next meeting of Council as to advisability of annexing to Corporation Limits and if they should find said extension advisable to report with a plat what Territory in their judgement ought to be added to and included in the Corporate limits of the Village.

An adjourned meeting of Council held on the 19th day of Dec 1882, Mr Dillaway Chairman of Public Property Committee moved as a Resolution the following proposed limits for the extension of the Corporation of the Village of Troy, O. to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the East line of Section 20 Town 5 Range 6, E. M. where the North line of the present Corporation intersects said Section line, it being the N. W. Corner of the present Corporate limits. Running thence West parallel with the E & W. line of said section about 60 Rods. Thence South parallel with the East line of said section to the South line of said section in the center of the Mcraig Pike. Thence East with said South line about 60 Rods to the N. W. Corner of Section 28, Town 5, Range 6, E. Thence South with the West line of said Section 28, to the S. W. Corner of said Section 28. Thence East with the South line of said Section 28, to the South East Corner of said Sec. 28, to the Center of the Troy and Dayton Pike. Thence South with the Center of the Troy and Dayton Pike about one half mile to the East & West half Section line of Fraction Section 34 Town 5 Range 6, E. Thence East with said half section line about one half mile to a point in the line of the East line of the present Corporation line - Projected Southwardly, Thence North in a line of the East line of the present Corporation Projected to a stone at the South East Corner of the present Corporation of Troy in what is known as Dyes Mill Road. The North and East line of the present Corporation to remain unchanged.

Mr Childs moved that the Resolution be amended to read, and extend said Corporation limits commencing at a point where the Corporation line intersects the Casstown Pike at the S. E. Corner of the Row Hill Cemetery. Thence North upon said line Projected with the East line of the Dayton & Michigan Rail Road to a point where the South line of the River Side Cemetery intersects the same, Thence West along the South line of said River Side Cemetery to a point where the same will meet the present Corporation line at the Miami River. Carried.

Mr Childs moved the adoption of the resolution as amended. Carried by the following vote, Yeas Hayner Childs, Dillaway & Drury. Nays, none.

Mr Dillaway moved that the solicitor be instructed to prepare an ordinance for the extension of the limits of the Corporation of the Village of Troy as passed by Council and report same at next meeting of Council. Passed by the following vote - Yeas Hayner Childs, Dillaway & Drury. - Nays, none.

At a regular meeting of Council held on the 9th day of January 1883. Ordinance No 194, entitled an ordinance authorizing the annexation of certain Territory to the Village of Troy, O. was on motion read the first time, on motion of Mr Dillaway the rules were suspended by the following vote. - Yeas - Childs, Hayner, Dillaway, Drury & Miller. - Nays, none.

Ordinance No. 194, was read the 2nd time, on motion of Mr Miller the rules were suspended by the following vote - Yeas - Childs, Hayner, Dillaway, Drury & Miller. Nays, none.

Ordinance No. 194, was read the third time, Mr Miller moved to place Ordinance No. 194, on its final passage. Carried by the following vote, Yeas, Childs, Hayner, Dillaway, Drury & Miller. Nays, none.

Transcript of Commissioners' Record of Proceedings in Annexation of New Territory to Village of Troy.
Regular Quarterly Session, Monday, March 5th, 1883. (And Notes of Testimony Marked "A.")

The Commissioners met this day; present—Lewis, Johnston and Clark, and the Auditor as Clerk.

A petition was this day filed by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Troy, through their duly appointed agent, praying for the annexation to said corporation of certain contiguous lands and lots as described in said petition, and as shown by plat accompanying, which was also filed; and the Board believing that the proceedings had by council in said matter are in accordance with the requirements of law, and the papers filed in the case are in due form, it is, upon motion, ordered that Thursday, May 10th, 1883, at 10 o'clock A. M. be fixed as the time when the Board will meet at the Auditor's office—for a hearing upon the petition—and that the agent of the Incorporated Village of Troy be notified of the action of the Board herein, and that the papers be kept on file by the Auditor for inspection of all parties interested in said matter, etc., as provided by Sections 1601, 1602, 1556, R. S.

Thursday, May 10, 1883.

The Board of Commissioners met this day to consider the petition for annexation of new territory to the village of Troy according to published notice of such appointment, Present—Lewis, Johnson and Clark, commissioners, and David Kelly, deputy auditor, as clerk.

The minutes of March 5th, 1883, relating to the matter now before the Board were read, and now come remonstrants by A. R. Byrket, attorney, and move the Board to strike out so much of the entry herein made on March 5th, 1883, as reads as follows; "And the Board believing that the proceedings had by council in said matter are in accordance with the requirements of law, and that the papers filed in the case are in due form" which motion of remonstrants the Board, upon motion, overruled, and to which ruling of the Board, the remonstrants, W. H. H. Dye, et al, except.

Upon motion, the minutes of March 5th, 1883, were approved as read, all the Board voting "aye."

In the matter of the certified copy of the ordinance filed in the case, objection is made by W. H. H. Dye, et al., remonstrants, by their attorney, as to the sufficiency of the proof as to such paper. Objection not sustained and exceptions filed—(as more fully shown in Exhibit "H" herewith attached.)

The agent of the corporation of Troy—T. M. Campbell—under oath, testified as to notices, advertised and posted, as follows, to-wit; Advertised in newspaper, as required by law, and posted in all the territory proposed to be annexed, in public places therein. And the Board, upon motion, find that the proof is sufficient as to proper notice being given of the pendency of this matter. (Remonstrants excepted. See Exhibit "H") And now come W. H. H. Dye, Adam Ruck, and twelve others, interested parties and land owners in proposed territory to be annexed, represented by A. R. Byrket, their attorney, and file a motion with the Board to dismiss the application of the Incorporated village of Troy for the annexation of the lands of said several parties to the said village for eight reasons therein set forth. Also come Levi Barnett, C. S. Williams, et al, remonstrants, represented by A. R. Byrket, and H. H. Williams, attorneys, and move the Commissioners to dismiss the application and discontinue proceedings in this case, for five reasons therein set forth, which motions are filed. (Marked "B" and "C"). Argument by council for Remonstrants and Petitioners was then heard on the motion to dismiss, and the Board, upon motion, adjourned until Thursday, next (May 17th) for further consideration and ruling upon said motions.

Thursday, May 17, 1883.

The Board met this day from adjournment of 10th inst. to consider the matter of annexation of New Territory to Troy. Present—Lewis, Johnson and Clark, commissioners, and the Auditor as clerk.

The minutes of May 10th were then read, whereupon, attorney for remonstrants objects to the approval of said minutes and moves the Board to make certain corrections therein, which motion is sustained by the Board, and corrections to be made as follows, to-wit: to add the following—
"Objection is made by remonstrants to the introduction of the printed notice published in the Miami Union, with the affidavit of C. S. Kessler, one of the proprietors thereto attached, for the reason that the same is incompetent as evidence in this case, and for the further reason that the seal of a Notary Public was not affixed to the same. And the said affidavit was then taken out by plaintiff's attorney, T. M. Campbell, who had only a few minutes before taken said affidavit, and a notarial seal attached. Whereupon, the Board rule that said notice and affidavit might be admitted as evidence, to which ruling of the Board, remonstrants by counsel except."

Also that the word sufficiency, relating to the proof as to a certified copy of the ordinance offered, be changed so as to read competency.

Also that the minutes relating to the objections offered as to notices having been posted, as required by law, be changed to show that Board did not overrule said objections of remonstrants, but that said objections was continued for a hearing until this day. The minutes as changed were then, upon motion, approved.

The matter now coming up before the Board upon all the several motions of remonstrants as filed, and the Board upon consideration of the same, do order, all the Board voting "aye", that each and all of objections be overruled, to which ruling of the Board, remonstrants except.

Upon motion, all the commissioners voting "aye", the Board decide to go upon the lands proposed to be annexed, and to carefully examine all of said several tracts, in which remonstrants are interested, with reference to the propriety of annexation of the same and, after said examination and adjournment, to meet again, at the Auditor's office in Troy, at 10 o'clock, A. M. on June 21st, 1883, for further proceedings in said matter.

Thursday, June 21, 1883.

The Commissioners met this day pursuant to adjournment (May 17th) to consider, and have a final hearing upon the matter of the extension of the corporate limits of the Village of Troy. Present—Commissioners Lewis, Johnson and Clark, and the Auditor as clerk. The minutes of May 17th were read and approved. Agent of the Village of Troy now asks to introduce certain testimony, and J. H. Conklin being first duly sworn, says he is the clerk of the Village and produced in evidence the present journal, or record, of the council of the village.

Remonstrants, by attorney, thereupon object to the introduction at this time of said journal as evidence in this cause. Upon consideration whereof, the Board find that this cause is to be tried upon its general merits, and the proof which the journal is introduced to show, is not necessary, and the objection is sustained.

The agent of the corporation then offers to introduce three other books and journals of the Village as evidence upon the merits of the case. Attorney for remonstrants objects to the introduction of said books, being records of ordinances, register of bonds and a former journal of the minutes of said village council. And the Board, upon consideration, and after argument is heard, do order the objection to be sustained. Agent for the Village then introduces and reads the affidavits of certain persons to show the value of the property to be annexed, and that said value is largely enhanced by reason of the proximity of said lands to the present corporate limits, and on account of the advantages derived from such close proximity of the village. A. R. Byrket, attorney for certain remonstrants, objects to the introduction of each and all of said affidavits and moves the Board to reject the same, as not being competent evidence upon the points intended to be proven. Argument is heard by peti-

petitioners' and remonstrants' attorneys, and the Board, upon motion, do overrule the objection, to which ruling A. R. Byrnett, for remonstrants, excepts. * Attorney for the village then produces the plat in evidence. Attorney for the village at this point rests his case upon the testimony. Remonstrants then introduce witnesses who, being sworn, are examined and give testimony upon the merits of the case. (as more fully shown in testimony hereto attached marked "H").

Oral testimony for the remonstrants

In the course of the testimony, attorney for remonstrants objects to the admission of evidence wherein the witness testifies that, in his opinion, the property of remonstrants ought to be annexed. Which objection the Board do overrule, and to which attorney for remonstrants excepts. Upon the conclusion of the oral testimony the remonstrants ask the Board to file a motion to dismiss the proceedings for the reasons set forth as follows, to-wit:

Motion filed.

That the law under which these proceedings are had is repugnant to the Constitution of the United States, and of the State of Ohio in this, to-wit: 1st. "That said law deprives these remonstrants from an appeal to the courts of higher resort, and deprives them of a trial by jury." 2nd. "That the proof shows, that the land of these remonstrants is sought to be annexed for the whole purpose of taxation, and that the commissioners have no power under the law to annex said lands for that purpose. (Signed)

By mutual consent, the ruling of the Board upon said motion to dismiss is reversed to the final action of the Board, and if then overruled, the remonstrants to have their exceptions noted. Argument of the attorneys for the village and for the remonstrants is then heard upon the merits of the case, and the Board, upon motion, agrees to reverse their decision in the matter at their next monthly meeting on July 2nd, 1883, and thereupon the Board is upon the Board is, upon motion, adjourned. Monday, July 2, 1883. The Board met this day in monthly session; all the members present, and the Auditor as clerk. The minutes of the last semi-monthly meeting were read and approved; all the minutes of the special meeting of June 21st. Upon motion, the Board then adjourned to meet again on Thursday next to decide upon the matter of extension of the corporate limits of Troy. Approved,

Thursday, July 5, 1883. The Board of Commissioners met this day according to adjournment of the 2nd inst. All the Board being present, and the Auditor as clerk. In the matter of the application of the incorporated village of Troy, O. for the annexation of certain territory thereto, this matter coming up for decision this day by the Board agreeably to their order of July 2nd and upon the motion of remonstrants attorneys to dismiss proceedings in this case, for reasons therein set forth, the Board do, upon consideration, order that the said motion be overruled, all the commissioners voting "aye" to which rule remonstrants except.

It is further ordered, upon motion, all the Board voting "aye" - that upon due consideration, the Commissioners do hereby find - First: That the petition herein filed contains all the matters required, and that its statements are true. Second: That the territory authorized to be annexed is accurately described, and that the annexation of said territory to said village will not make the limits of said village, unreasonably large. Third: That the map, or plat, accompanying said petition is accurate. Fourth: That notice has been given, as required by law. And, moreover, it seeming right to the commissioners that the prayer of said petition should be granted, it is therefore, on motion, ordered by the Board - Lewis, Johnson and Clark voting "aye" - that the prayer of said petition be and is hereby granted, and all the territory in said petition described is hereby annexed to, and made a part of said incorporated village of Troy, and the corporate limits of said village are extended accordingly.

It is further ordered, that the Auditor shall prepare a certified transcript of the proceedings of the Board, herein, as provided in Section 1559, Revised Statutes, in readiness to be signed by the commissioners, and that the Auditor shall then file the same, together with all other papers submitted in the case, in the office of County Recorder. To the final ruling of the Board, and to all of the findings made, remonstrants, by attorney except.

The Board then, upon motion, adjourns. Approved, C. D. Lewis, President.

Byrnett, of defendant's council, offered a motion to strike out that portion of said minutes which reads as follows: "and the Board believing that the proceedings held by the council, in said matter, are in accordance with the requirements of law, and the papers filed, in the case are in due form —"

Thereupon the Board do overrule the said motion, to which ruling and opinion of the Board, the defendants except, said defendants as follows: W. H. H. Dye, Adam Ruck, George Glass, Dye & Weller, Thomas C. Dye, et al., Margaret Brown, The Cincinnati Ice Co., James H. Young, C. H. McCullough, Fred Miller, Artemus Eaton, H. C. Eaton, William Turner, D. A. McClung, C. S. Williams, A. R. Byrnett and Levi Barnett. Plaintiff offered in evidence the printed notice published in the Miami Union, with the affidavit of C. S. Kessler, as one of the publishers, thereto attached, to which defendants objected, for reason that the same is incompetent as evidence in this case, and for the further reason that the seal of the Notary Public was not affixed to the same.

Plaintiff's council, J. M. Campbell, who had only a few minutes before taken the affidavit, thereupon retired to the office of Mr George Green, and affixed a notarial seal to the said jurat, and again offered the same in evidence, to which defendants, by their council, objected as incompetent.

Thereupon the Board ruled that said notice and affidavit might be admitted as evidence, to which ruling and opinion of the Board, the defendants, W. H. H. Dye, Adam Ruck, Geo. Byrnett, and Levi Barnett, by their council, except.

Defendants, by counsel, also object to the introduction, in evidence, of the paper attached to the plaintiff's petition purporting to be a copy of the ordinance of the village of Troy, and deny that such ordinance was passed, for the purposes of this case, and move the Board that said ordinance be stricken out, whereupon the Board do overrule said motion and permit said ordinance to be used as evidence, to which ruling and opinion of the Board, the said defendants, by their council, object, and do except to the same.

Thereupon the petitioners proceed to introduce the testimony of sundry witnesses;

5th Thereupon defendants file their certain motion to dismiss the cause, which said motion is as follows:

Motion.

To the Board of Commissioners of Miami County, Ohio:

In the matter of the extension of the corporate limits of Troy, Ohio; And now come W. H. H. Dye, Adam Ruck,

George Glass, Dye & Keller, Thomas C. Dye, Margaret Brown, The Cincinnati Ice Co., James H. Young, C. H. McCullough, Fred Miller, Artemus Eaton, H. C. Eaton, William Turner, D. A. McLung, A. R. Byrketts, Levi Barnett, C. S. Williams and S. B. & W. Ry. Co., and move the Court to dismiss the application of the Incorporation of Troy, O., for the annexation to the corporation of the several and separate lots of land belonging to all and each of them severally, as far as said application effects said land, and for the following reasons, to-wit:

- 1st. Said petition, or application, does not contain facts sufficient to authorize the Commissioners to act thereupon.

The Board of Commissioners Second Day, Thursday, May 17, 1883.

The Board of Commissioners met as per adjournment. The minutes of the meeting of May 10th. were read by the Auditor, and some corrections ordered as to the phraseology of the minutes, Mr Campbell, of counsel for petitioners, asks leave to introduce the Journal of the Council of the Village of Troy, to show the passage of the ordinance, and the vote thereon.

Defendants counsel object to the introduction of the said record, and the Board refused to enter into the matter at the present state of the case.

Mr. Campbell: "I want to make a statement to the Board."

Mr. Byrketts: "We object."

Commissioner Clark: "The matter was discussed the other day; you may ask the question, but we will reserve the right to answer."

Mr. Campbell: "The question is simply this: Will you look at the Journal of the Council of the date that ordinance purports to be passed?"

Mr. Clark: "That thing we havent come to yet; we will pass on that after awhile."

Mr. Campbell: "I offer to introduce the record to the Board."

Mr. Byrketts: "We object."

Thereupon the Board announced that the motions to dismiss the cause, for reasons on file, and heretofore presented to the Board, are by said Board overruled, to which ruling and opinion of the Board the defendants, W. H. H. Dye, Adam Ruck, George Glass, Dye & Weller, Thomas C. Dye, et al., Margaret Brown, The Cincinnati Ice Co., James H. Young, C. H. McCullough, Fred Miller, Artemus Eaton, William Turner, D. A. Thereupon the Board adjourned the further hearing until Thursday June 21, 1883.

Third Day, Thursday, June 21, 1883.

The Board of Commissioners met as per adjournment, and the parties hereto, by their counsel, being present, further hearing of this cause was resumed.

Petition.

The plaintiffs, W. H. H. Dye, The Indiana Bloomington and Western Railway Co., Adam Ruck, Geo. Glass, Dye & Weller, Thomas C. Dye, Margaret Brown, The Cincinnati Ice Co., and James H. Young, complain of the Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, Isaac A. Landis and John H. Conklin for that the said Indiana Bloomington and Western Railway Co. is a railroad corporation, duly organized under the laws of this State of Ohio, and that Dye & Weller are a firm doing business at Troy, Miami County, Ohio, and further that six plaintiffs are respectively the owners of the following described real estate, to-wit:

40 acres out of the center part of the east one-half of the north west quarter of section 34, Township 5, Range 6, E. M., Miami County, Ohio; also 12 acres, part of lot (3), same section, township and range; all belonging to W. H. H. Dye. Also the following described real estate belonging to Dye & Weller, to-wit; 28 ⁷²/₁₀₀ acres out of the center part of the east half of the north-west quarter of section 34, Township 5, range 6, E. M. Miami County, Ohio; also three (3) acres, same section, township and range, being

part of lot three (3); also $7/100$ acres in same section, township and range, being the east part of the north-west quarter; the last tract belonging to Thomas S. Dye, et al. Also the following described real estate belonging to the Indiana, Bloomington & Western Railway Co., to-wit: .53 miles of track lying south-west of the present corporate limits of Troy, Ohio. Also the following described real estate, to-wit: 9.31 acres out of the south-east corner of the south-west quarter of section 27, township 5, range 6, M. R. S., and belonging to Adam Ruck. Also the following described real estate belonging to James H. Young, to-wit: 21 acres out of the south-west corner of the south-west quarter of section 27, township 5, range 6, E. M., Miami County, Ohio; also 3.4 acres out of the north-west corner of the south-west quarter of the same section, township and range. Also the following described real estate belonging to Margaret Brown, to-wit; 15 acres being out of lot ten (10), section 27, township 5, range 6, E. M., Miami County, Ohio. Also the following described real estate belonging to The Cincinnati Ice Co., to-wit: $217/100$ acres in sections 27 and 34, township 5, range 6, E. M., Miami County, Ohio. Also the ice privilege belonging to said company, or what is commonly known as Dye's pond.

And these plaintiffs further say that upon the 15th day of May of March, 1883, The Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, purported to file in the Auditor's office of Miami County, O., the said Auditor's office also being the office of the Commissioners of said county, its certain petitions directed to the Commissioners of said county praying for the annexation of the above described and other lands to the corporate limits of said village, and that such proceedings might be had and taken by and before said commissioners as would result in the annexation of said lands to said corporation, and at the same time a plat purporting to be a plat of said lands was filed therewith, and that upon that day and afterwards, to-wit: upon the 10th day of May, 1883, the 17th day of May, 1883, the 21st day of June, 1883, July 2nd, 1883, and July 5th, 1883, such proceedings were had as resulted in the order following:

"It is further ordered upon motion, all the board voting 'aye,' that upon due consideration, the commissioners do hereby find: First. That the petition herein filed contains all the matters required, and that its statements are true. Second. That the territory authorized to be annexed is accurately described, and that the annexation of said territory to said village will not make the limits of said village unreasonably large. Third. The map, or plat, accompanying said petition is accurate. Fourth. That notice has been given as required by law. And, moreover, it seeming right to the commissioners that the prayer of said petitioner should be granted, it is therefore ordered, upon motion by the board, Lewis Johnson and Clark voting 'aye,' that the prayer of said petition should be granted. It is therefore ordered, upon motion by the Board, Lewis Johnson and Clark voting 'aye,' that the petition of said petitioner be and is hereby granted, and all the territory in said petition described is hereby annexed to and made a part of said incorporated Village of Troy, O., and the corporate limits of said village are extended accordingly. It is further ordered that the Auditor should prepare a certified transcript of the transcripts of the proceedings of the Board herein as provided in section 1557, Revised Statutes, in readiness to be signed by the commissioners, and the Auditor should then file the same, together with all the other papers submitted in the case, in the office of County Recorder.

To the final ruling of the Board, and to each and all of the findings made, remonstrated by attorney except a full and true copy of the record and proceedings of said Board of Commissioners, in which case, with all the papers, pleadings, motions, exceptions and evidence, is herewith attached. Marked exhibit "X" and filed herewith and made a part hereof; and that plaintiffs aver that there is error in said record and proceedings in this to-wit:

1st. The Board erred in passing upon the sufficiency of the petition and the regularity of the proceedings of the Council in the matter of their annexation upon the day when their petition was filed.

2nd. The Board erred in passing upon the regularity of said proceedings and the sufficiency of said petition before the notice required by law had been given, and before the plaintiffs had an opportunity to be heard.

3rd. The Board erred in finding that the proceedings of council in said matter were in accordance with the requirements of law, there being no evidence to support said finding.

- 4th. The Board erred in refusing, at their meeting of May 10th, 1883, to strike out the words, "And the Board believing that the proceedings, held by the council in said matter, are in accordance with the requirements of law and the papers filed in the case are in due form" of their ^{entry} of March 5th. and permit these plaintiffs to be heard upon the questions then passed upon.
- 5th. The Board erred in overruling the objection of these plaintiffs to the introduction of the printed notices as evidence in the case.
- 6th. The Board erred in permitting Campbell to attach seal to the affidavit of C. S. Kessler, and then to receive such affidavit as evidence of publication in this case.
- 7th. The Board erred in overruling the objections of these plaintiffs to the introduction of the printed copy of what purported to be an ordinance of the Incorporated Village of Troy, O., which printed copy is attached to said petition, as evidence in this case.
- 8th. The Board erred in receiving the testimony of persons sworn by D. Kelly, only.
- 9th. The Board erred in admitting the certified copy of what purported to be an ordinance of the Incorporated Village of Troy, O., as evidence in this case.
- 10th. The Board erred in overruling the motion of W. H. H. Dye, et al. to dismiss this case for reasons therein stated.
- 11th. The Board erred in permitting the affidavits of D. A. McLeung, N. G. Kulp, D. W. Simpson and Geo. W. Scott to be introduced as evidence in this case.
- 12th. The Board erred in overruling the motion of these plaintiffs filed with the clerk of said board June 21st, 1883, to dismiss this case for reasons therein stated.
- 13th. The Board erred in the first Finding, "That the petition herein filed contained all the matters required and that its statements are true" there being no legal evidence whatever to sustain said finding.
- 14th. The Board erred in its second Finding "That the territory sought to be annexed is accurately described" there being no evidence whatever to support such finding.
- 15th. The Board erred in its Third Finding "That the map, or plat, accompanying said petition is accurate" there being no proof whatever to sustain said finding.
- 16th. The Board erred in its Fourth Finding "That notice has been given as required by law."
- 17th. The Board erred in ordering said annexation upon the pleadings and proofs that were before them.
- 18th. The Board erred in ordering a certified transcript of the record, papers and proceedings in this case to be made out by the auditor, as clerk of said board, and by him to be filed in the office of recorder of said county.
- And these plaintiffs further say that the common council of said Incorporated Village of Troy, O., never passed an ordinance authorizing the annexation of these plaintiffs' lands, or appointed by an ordinance, the village solicitor, or any one else and authorized them to prosecute any proceedings before the county Commissioners for the annexation of these plaintiffs' lands.
- The further say that upon the 9th. day of January, 1883, the date alleged in said petition for the passage of said ordinance set out therein, there was no such ordinance before council. That at certain ordinance numbered 194, entitled an ordinance for the annexation of certain territory to the Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, was before said council, but of what were the provisions of said ordinance these plaintiffs are not informed, but that said ordinance, whatever may have been its provisions, was not legally passed by said council, for the reason that said ordinance was not fully read upon their three different days as required by law, nor was the rule requiring it to be so read ever suspended for that purpose, and said ordinance passed under such suspension. And said plaintiffs further say that said pretended ordinance was never signed after its pretended passage, or never signed at all, but that what purported to be a copy thereof was signed by said mayor, and clerk, but that long after the adjournment of council, and that said purported or

pretended copy was never submitted to the approval of council either before or after said signatures were attached thereto, and that such pretended ordinance set out in the application to said commissioners for said extension is but a copy of said pretended or purported copy.

And these plaintiffs say that no notice as required by law was ever given of the pendency of said application before said commissioners before the commissioners took action upon said petition. That the notices posted up were of very fine print and were of such a character that they could not be read at a distance greater than two or three feet therefrom, and were of such a character as to defeat rather than comply with, and meet the purposes of the law in requiring them to be passed. And these plaintiffs further aver and say that no accurate map of the territory sought to be annexed was filed with said petition, and that no accurate description of the territory to be annexed was therein contained.

And these plaintiffs further say that upon the day the petition in this case for the annexation of said lands was filed in the office of said commissioners and before any notice of the filing and pendency thereof, and contrary to law, passed upon the sufficiency, validity and regularity of the proceedings had by the council of the Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, in reference to the annexation of their said lands, and that afterwards upon the day set forth the hearing of said petition, to-wit: May 10th. 1883. upon motion of these plaintiffs made to them to that effect, refused to vacate said finding and permit these plaintiffs to contest the sufficiency, regularity and validity of said proceedings of said council, but did without any proof whatever to that effect, and in violation of law so find. And these plaintiffs further say that said commissioners, upon the trial of this cause, received as evidence of the fact of such ordinance the printed copy of what purported to be an ordinance of the Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, and that without any proof whatever that said printed copy had been published under the authority of the Corporation. And plaintiffs further say that upon this day of 1883. they filed a motion to dismiss said cause because—

1st. Said petition or application does not contain facts sufficient to authorize the commissioners to act thereon.

2nd. There is no averment in said petition, or application, that the people, or inhabitants generally of Troy, O., desire to enlarge the corporate limits of by the annexation of said lands.

3rd. The petition, or application, does not aver that any steps were taken by the council of said town of Troy, to ascertain whether or not the inhabitants of said town generally desired the annexation of said lands, or that such was found to be the facts by said council before the passage of the ordinance set out in said petition.

4th. The petition does not contain an accurate description of the territory sought to be annexed.

5th. The petition does not have accompanying it a correct plat of the lands sought to be annexed.

6th. The notice of this hearing required by law has never been given.

7th. That there exists no necessity for the annexation of said territory, nor is the same required for any of the uses or purposes of an incorporated village, and that the corporate limits of said village are unreasonably large.

8th. That said annexation is sought for the sole purpose of taxation and for the purpose of subjecting said lands to the payment of taxes, in which the owners have no interest or benefit, and it would be unjust and oppressive to cause said lands to be annexed. And these plaintiffs further say, that upon the 21st. day of June, and while this cause was still pending, these plaintiffs filed a motion to dismiss, because—

That said law deprives these remonstrants from an appeal to the court of higher resort, and deprives them of a trial by jury. That the proof shows that the land of these remonstrants are sought to be annexed for the sole purpose of taxation, and that the commissioners have no power under the law to annex said lands for that purpose. And these plaintiffs further say that said commissioners found that the petition filed in this court contained all of the matters required, and that its statements are true. And these plaintiffs say that there was no legal evidence whatever heard by said

commissioners to support said finding; and further, that without any evidence whatever to that effect, said board found that said territory sought to be annexed had been accurately described in said petition, and that the map accompanying said petition is correct. And these plaintiffs further say that said commissioners found that the annexation of said territory, as described in said petition, would not make the corporate limits of said Village of Troy, O., unreasonably large, and that without any evidence to that effect whatever, and that it would be just and proper to annex said territory without evidence to support said finding; and these plaintiffs further say that said commissioners ordered the annexation of said lands to the corporate limits of said Incorporated Village of Troy, O., without any legal proof whatever to support any single averment of said petition, and without any averment in the petition that the facts so found to be true, were true. And these plaintiffs further say the annexation of said territory is not needed for any use or purpose of said Incorporated Village of Troy, O., nor is its annexation necessary, nor will it be conducive to the better exercise of any of its functions, powers, duties or privileges of said corporation. That said corporation is in excellent financial condition and is amply able to pay all its obligations, and has ample means to pay all its obligations, and to carry on its corporate government, yet annexation is sought for the purpose of subjecting said lands to municipal taxation only. And these plaintiffs further say that the corporate limits of said corporation are already unreasonably large. That there are now only about 900 lots upon which there are buildings, while there are 700 sub-divided lots not in use, and sufficient territory which, when sub-divided, to make 16,000 more lots in the present corporation of said village, and the territory sought to be annexed would make at least 3,000 more of the ordinary size of lots in said village. These plaintiffs further say that Chas. C. Barnett, auditor of said county, and by virtue of that position, clerk of the board of commissioners did, in obedience to said order of said board of commissioners, proceed to make out a true copy of the record, papers and proceedings of said board of commissioners, signed by each member thereof in this cause, and did certify to the correctness thereof and cause the same, on the 15th day of July, 1883, to be filed in the office of the Recorder of said county for record, and that he has filed said transcript in his office, and S. A. Landis, recorder of said county, is about to cause said certified transcript of said record and proceedings to be spread upon the public records of said county and to cause a certified transcript thereof to be sent to the Secretary of the State of Ohio, and one to be delivered to the agent of the Incorporated Village of Troy, O., and that without any warrant or authority of law whatever, therefore and hereby, to make it appear that the corporate limits of said village had been extended so as to include the lands of these plaintiffs. And these plaintiffs further say that the Incorporated Village of Troy, O., is about to exercise jurisdiction, police, and otherwise, over their said lands, and to place burdensome and unlawful assessments and taxes thereon, and that John H. Booklin, who is the clerk of said corporation, is about to lay before the council of said village a certified copy of said record and proceedings of said board of commissioners for their acceptance or rejection. And these plaintiffs further say that no steps were ever taken to ascertain whether or not the citizens generally, or any part thereof of said village, desire to enlarge the corporate limits by the annexation of contiguous territory, or that the council of said village, even by resolution or otherwise, acted thereon, in any manner declared that such desire existed, nor was there any evidence that any action upon this subject whatever had been had upon the trial of this cause before said board of commissioners. And these plaintiffs say that upon trial of said cause before said board, there was no evidence that the village or council of said Incorporated Village of Troy, O., ever passed an ordinance authorizing the annexation of contiguous territory as alleged in said petition, nor does said petition contain any accurate description of said contiguous territory sought to be annexed, nor is it accompanied by an accurate map, or plat, thereof. Nor was there any proof whatever offered upon these propositions before said board upon the trial of this cause.

And these plaintiffs further say that there was no evidence before said board that notice of the

hearing of said cause before said board of commissioners was published in a newspaper printed and of general circulation in said county for six weeks prior to said hearing, nor that there was a copy of said notice posted upon the lands of these plaintiffs, or any one of them, except that of Dye & Keller, for a period of more than six weeks prior to the time of fixing for such hearing, and these plaintiffs further say that the territory, or lands belonging to these plaintiffs, and sought to be annexed to said village, are not needed by said village for any legitimate use or purpose. That there are now almost as many vacant lots in said village as are occupied by buildings, and the territory sought to be annexed and already annexed exclusive of the lands owned by these plaintiffs, will furnish over Three Thousand lots wholly unoccupied to about 1,600 lots occupied; and further, that the lands of these plaintiffs are sought to be annexed for the purpose of taxation only.

These plaintiffs further say that unless restrained and enjoined from so doing, the said Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, John H. Conklin, and Isaac A. Landis will proceed to cause the proper record to be made to place these plaintiffs' lands within the corporate limits of said village, to the great and irreparable injury of said plaintiffs.

Wherefore, they pray that the said The Incorporated Village of Troy, O. May be enjoined from further proceedings on said petition to annex these plaintiffs' lands; that John H. Conklin may be enjoined from laying a transcript of said proceedings with the accompanying map, or plat, before the council of said The Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, or from taking further action therein.

That Isaac A. Landis be enjoined from placing said transcript of said proceedings upon the records of said county, or from sending a copy thereof to the Secretary of State of the State of Ohio, and for such other and further relief as in equity they may be entitled to.

Conklin, for answer to plaintiffs amended petition, say that on the 9th day of January, 1883, the council of said Incorporated Village of Troy, Ohio, at a regular meeting thereof, by a majority of all the members elected thereto, passed an ordinance authorizing the territory in said petition described and other territory to be annexed to the corporation of said Village of Troy, O. That said ordinance was, upon its passage, duly signed by the mayor and clerk of said Village; that said ordinance was published in the Miami Union, a newspaper published in, and of general circulation in said village of Troy and said county of Miami, on the 13th day of January, 1883. That said ordinance authorized and directed the the solicitor of said said village of Troy to prosecute the necessary proceedings to effect said annexation, and contained an accurate description of all the territory sought to be annexed, including the territory in plaintiffs' petition described. At an adjourned meeting held on the 15th day of Nov. 1889, Mr. Schaible Chairman of the Street and Alley Committee to whom was referred the matter of Extension of the limits of the Incorporated Village of Troy, O. moved the adoption of the following resolution. Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Piqua that said City join with said petitioners in their said petition to the County Commissioners of Miami County, Ohio asking that all that part of the said Village of Huntersville be detached from said Village and annexed to and made a part of said City of Piqua, lying within the following boundaries, to-wit:-

B. Jamison, to prosecute such proceedings as to bring the same about; that by virtue thereof, said City, joining with said petitioners, from said territory of said Village of Huntersville, presented its petition to the said Board of County Commissioners, asking that such detachment and annexation be made and accompanied their said petition with an accurate plat of the premises sought thereby to be detached and annexed. and forty-nine one hundred and fiftieth part thereof, which we adjudge to be \$13.33 to be paid by that part of said Village not sought to be annexed, and \$1986.67 to be paid by said City.

4th As touching credits we adjudge from the proportion, aforesaid, that said City shall receive the one hundred and forty-nine one hundred and fiftieth part of all monies and credits belonging to said Village and that said part of said Village not sought to be annexed to said City shall be entitled to the one one hundred and fiftieth part thereof, which we ascertain to be \$214.56 to be received by said City of Piqua and \$1.44 to be received by said territory not sought to be annexed.

5th We do hereby order said payments, deducting said credits to be paid as aforesaid.

6th We do also order the Auditor of this County to certify a transcript of the proceedings in this matter and the plat describing said part of said Village sought to be annexed to the City Clerk of the City of Piqua, to be by said City acted upon as by law in such cases made and provided. Whereas, touching monies and credits of said Village said Board from the proportion aforesaid, adjudges that said City receive the one hundred and forty-nine one hundred and fiftieth part, amounting to \$24.56 and that the part of said Village not sought to be annexed receive 1/150 part thereof, amounting to \$1.44 and

Whereas, said Board did then order said payments, after deducting the said credits, to be accordingly made, now therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Piqua, that the action and proceedings of said Board of County Commissioners be and the same is, hereby approved, ratified and accepted and the City Clerk of said City is hereby directed to make and certify two transcripts of all the ordinances and other papers in this matter, one of which he is directed to file for record and file with the County Recorder of said Miami County, Ohio and the other he is directed to file in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Ohio.







Plat of Unnumbered Lots Troy Ohio.










